BACK TO LAND SAYS KINGSLEY

Lecturer Would Break Up the Cities by Freeing the Land From Burdens.

Last night E. T. Kingsley of Vancouver gave his second lecture in the Westholme Theatre, the burden of his address being "back to the land." He told how if 75 per cent of the population, including the working class of the city and country would get together they could capture the reins of government.

When in power the first thing to do would be to release the land from all burdens of ownership and mortgage and then parcel it out as they did in Russia, give every man a piece and the cities would then fall to pieces. The capitalist class would starve unless they were willing each to take a plot of land and work too. Railways and big buildings would no longer be necessary under that system. Iron and steel and other minerals would not be necessary.

Mr. Kingsley took a long time to explain that the farmer could produce with primitive tools at least four times as much as he could use. With modern machinery he could do very much better. Most of the things which were done in the city were useless and were only for the purpose of keeping up the great ruling class.

The attendance was not very large and there was little enthusiasm, the average worker here evidently not being enthused with the idea of having to go back to the land and working without the luxuries of life to which he has been used.

Visit of Inspection of New Board of the Dolly Varden Mines.

The directors of the Dolly Varden Mines, Ltd., all went north on Saturday night en route to Alice Arm and the Dolly Varden properties. Included in the party were A. J. T. Tennor, of the Pacific Lime Co.; Walter Leek, wholesaler; Hall C. Chiene, chartered accountant, and J. S. Cowper, M. P. P., formerly editor of the Prince Rupert Daily News.

Mr. Taylor said their mine was already being worked and that in the near future the railway would be completed and they would be shipping ore.

GIVE WOMEN EQUAL RIGHTS

Emancipation Bill Fails to Pass But Government Will Bring In Measure.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) London, July 5.—The Women's Emancipation Bill was defeated in the House of Commons by a vote of 100 to 85. It is announced however, that the Government next week intends to introduce a bill to take its place which will provide for giving women equal rights with men in civilian and judicial matters.

Seven Thousand Men Who Went To Work This Morning To Leave Early.
