11,000,000 FT. LOGS ARE SOLD

Whalen Pulp and Paper Company Make Purchase at \$3.70 A Thousand.

On Saturday Sheriff Shirley sold a quantity of logs belonging to the T. A. Kelley Logging Co. on Moresby Island to satisfy claims for wages. The sale took place at the Prince Rupert Court House.

The purchasers were the Whalen Pulp and Paper Co. who will use the logs in the pulp mill at Swanson Bay. It is understood that the rafts will be towed to their destination at once.

There were about eleven million feet in all and the only bid was that of the Whalen Company for \$3.70 a thousand, at which price they were sold. The Government officials reported that the logs were slightly injured by teredo.

DOLLY VARDEN TITLE MUST BE REGISTERED

Vancouver, July 4.—The right of the Taylor Engineering Company to obtain registration of an absolute title to all the mines, claims and properties of the Dolly Varden Mining Company was upheld by Mr. Justice Murphy after a lengthy debate between Mr. E. C. Mayers, representing the Taylor Engineering Company, and Registrar General A. G. Smith, of Victoria.

"The Registrar's duty is as clear as words can make it. He must register these titles in the Taylor Engineering Company on production of the proofs set out in the act," said His Lordship, who informed the Registrar-General that the title given to the Taylor Engineering Company under the special act of the Legislature was a statutory title, and better than any crown grant.

How Everyone Can Help

THE Government has developed a liberal and broad plan to help soldiers settle on farms. It is securing land. It is granting substantial loans. It is obtaining advantageous prices on equipment, implements, building materials and live stock. It is providing agricultural training and farming supervision.

That is as much as the Government itself can do.

But the plan needs more. It needs a community spirit of co-operation.

Already Provincial Governments, Universities, Farmers' Associations, and Veterans' Associations are giving valuable assistance. They can lend him an extra horse or plough, give him a day's help at seeding or harvest time, and extend to him that friendly, neighborly, respectful spirit which he deserves.

In this way Canada is performing a double duty. It is discharging, as far as possible, the debt we owe to our soldiers; and it is adding to the country's chief industry a body of competent, willing producers.
