DR. SPENCER PASSES AWAY

Well and Favorably Known Bella Bella Medical Missionary Spent Almost all his Life in the North

It will be with genuine feelings of regret that many friends not only in the city of Prince Rupert but throughout the north will learn of the sudden death which occurred at Bella Bella on Wednesday of this week of Rev. Dr. John Clark Spencer, pioneer United Church medical missionary, who spent almost his entire life in Northern British Columbia carrying on his ministrations of physical and spiritual aid to the early whites and native residents. Word of Dr. Spencer's death was received this morning, his son, Harold Spencer of the Granby Co. staff at Anyox, having been a passenger aboard the Prince Rupert going through to Bella Bella where he will attend his father's funeral.

The late Dr. Spencer, who was born in the Maritimes some sixty years ago, came to this coast as a comparatively young man and his places of residence included Bella Coola, Queen Charlotte Islands, Port Simpson and Bella Bella. At each point he spent many years. He was widely known and highly regarded and, during his several years at Port Simpson, was a frequent visitor in Prince Rupert, having often been heard in the pulpit of the local United—then the Methodist—Church.

Besides his widow, the late Dr. Spencer is survived by four children—Harold Spencer, Anyox; Mrs. C. B. Flewin, Port Simpson; Miss Bertha Spencer, Toronto, and Ralph Spencer at Bella Bella.

MENNONITES ARE GIVING UP CUSTOMS

Gradually Adopting Modern Methods but This Causes

TORONTO, Feb. 24.—"I have to go to the village to telephone. Why shouldn't I have a 'phone in my house?" This was the question put not long ago to Miss Mable Dunham, author of "Toward London," by a Mennonite farmer, who had somewhat "fallen from grace" in the eyes of his co-religionists by allowing electric light and other modern improvements to be "installed."

In an address given before the Authors' Association recently Miss Dunham, of Kitchener, Ont., gave many odd instances of those who were "the original fundamentalists." Descended from Bishop Eby of Ebytown, Ontario, later Berlin and later still, Kitchener, Miss Dunham has a clear conception of the excellent qualities of these settlers and also sees the humor in some of their theories. She wishes to explain them to those who do not understand them; she also hopes they too may understand criticism, kindly meant.

"They take everything so literally; you will find no photographs of the Mennonites, because they think it is against the Commandments to make a likeness."

"The question of bonnets not so very long ago made the erection of a new church necessary. They are always having 'spliffs' in the churches—it may be over the question of driving-sheds (which has resulted in adjacent churches in one case)."

But as to the bonnets! The younger generation going out into industrial life found it irksome to be pointed out as a peculiar people; and they gave up the old headgear; so then they had to have a meeting-place to themselves. In one church, the other day it was decided to have some musical instrument installed, "either a piano, or an organ."

Miss Dunham writes after her day's work at the library is over. "I always stop at 2 a.m. I think that's enough for anyone," she said. "I would like to write historical stories for Canadian girls and boys—I do not care whether I am known by our neighbors to the south, or not, so long as Canadians will read my books and find them interesting."

GREAT SPEED OF BRITISHER

Captain Malcolm Campbell Drives 206 Miles an Hour at Daytona Beach

DAYTON BEACH, Florida, Feb. 24.—Making an exhibition run Captain Malcolm Campbell, the British auto racer, negotiated a measured mile at an average speed of a little more than 206 miles an hour. This was slightly less than his world record which was 205.9 miles an hour.

LITTLE SMOKEY RIVER INFESTED WITH GAME

Moose and Deer in Abundance and Impossible to Keep Them From Hay

EDMONTON, Feb. 24.—Bands of moose are driving his pack-horses away from the stacks of wild hay put up for them in the fall along the flats in the valley of the little Smokey River, according to Charlie Pandricks, western trapper, who is in the city disposing of his catch.

One stack has already been eaten up by the moose and it is impossible to keep them away from the remaining stacks, owing to the fact that the trapper is absent from his headquarters cabin for 14 days at a time.

"It looks as though I will have to shoot two of my six horses if this keeps up," said Pandricks. "A heck of a note when the moose live off the trapper, instead of the trapper living off the moose."

In one day's travel the trapper counted 75 moose and 30 deer. There are also about 300 caribou in the valley of the little Smokey, ranging around in bands of 20 to 30 animals. They have never been in the valley before.

None of the caribou or deer have come near the stacks. When the trapper is at home, the barking of his dog-team and the presence of humans keeps the moose at a distance from the meadows. But they came back as soon as the trapper and his brother, John, have left again. Fences have been repeatedly broken, the trapper added.
