CANADIAN NATIONAL COAST STEAMSHIPS FALL SCHEDULE

With the arrival of the SS. "Prince Rupert" from Vancouver Wednesday, September 12, the Fall Schedule will be effective. The big boats will arrive from

Vancouver and intermediate points each Wednesday and Saturday at 10.30 a.m., sailing for Vancouver each Thursday and Sunday 11.00 p.m.; sailing for Stewart Wednesday 10.00 p.m.; for Anyox and Ketchikan Saturdays 4.00 p.m. Note particularly change in sailing days for Stewart and Anyox. Effective September 22, fortnightly service will be restored via Queen Charlotte Islands, boat sailing from Prince Rupert fortnightly for Vancouver, calling all Island points en route.
