## HARRY HANSON VISITS USK AND TELLS OF IT

Development of Mines, Mills and Waterpower Important Factors In Progress of Place.

Harry Hanson, the plumber, who has just returned from a trip up the river to Usk combining business and pleasure, is enthusiastic regarding the prospects at that place. He says:

"The Kleanza Mining, Milling and Development Co. at Gold Creek is developing prospects in the vicinity. Mr. Willemann is the manager. The tourists from Dakota visited this place, as most of them, it is understood, are interested financially in it. Another party from Minnesota will soon be out to investigate.

**Unique Ferry.**

"The camp is an ideal one located a stone's throw from Gold Creek from which electric power will be developed for the treatment of the ore. The Government has men making the road from Usk to the mine and to Kitselas. The ferry is a unique one. Two large boats are built together with a travelling crane attached to a cable suspended high above the river. By putting the boats out at an angle of nearly forty-five degrees the current swiftly carries them across, so that large loads may be transported with ease.

"Along the banks placer gold can be plainly seen about half a mile above the ferry and here I believe dredge mining would be a profitable investment. The formation is similar to Oroville, California, where millions of dollars have been taken out.

"The Kleanza Company intends also to go into the pulp business and they are building a mill for that purpose.

"The Kinney Brothers have just erected a lumber mill and the Georgetown Lumber Co. is putting up a sawmill and cabins are being built for the use of the men. The mill is expected to be ready in about six weeks' time. Something like sixty men will be employed. K. L. Rauck has 160 acres of fine timber land near Usk and has arranged with the Georgetown mill to log it.

**Kitselas Mine.**

"At the Kitselas Mountain Copper Co.'s mine, of which Paul M. French is president, J. O. Wells, vice-president, and A. J. Thompson, treasurer, a lot of money has been spent. A road has been built and half a mile of pipe put in, and operation will soon commence on a large scale. Quite a number of Americans are interested here. At Usk generally Americans and Canadians seem to be divided evenly.

"A hotel run by Mrs. Durham is located immediately across from the station and about twelve houses have recently been built. The store is being enlarged, a poolroom and billiardroom is to be built, the store is being enlarged, a moving picture theatre is to be erected and electricity is to be provided by the mill.

"Olof Hanson of Prince Rupert has a tie camp about three miles from Usk."

## WIFE OF BELA KUN REFUSED TO CROSS LINE

People of Switzerland Do Not Want Her in That Country So She Remains in Hungary.

Geneva, July 7.—Madam Bela Kun, wife of the Foreign Minister of the Hungarian Soviet Government, arrived on the frontier yesterday, but was not allowed to cross by the authorities who applied the new law controlling the entry of aliens.

The wife of the Hungarian Bolshevik dictator, it is said, intended to engage in Bolshevik propaganda. She took several trunks and many servants with her.

PRINCE RUPERT WATERFRONT LEASE

SEALED TENDERS will be received by the Minister of Lands, at Victoria, B. ## How Everyone Can Help

THE Government has developed a liberal and broad plan to help soldiers settle on farms. It is securing land. It is granting substantial loans. It is obtaining advantageous prices on equipment, implements, building materials and live stock. It is providing agricultural training and farming supervision.

That is as much as the Government itself can do.

But the plan needs more. It needs a community spirit of co-operation.

Already Provincial Governments, Universities, Farmers' Associations, and Veterans' Associations are giving valuable assistance. Many manufacturers and sellers of farm supplies have agreed to allow the soldier settlers special prices. Many successful farmers have willingly worked on Qualification Committees which have to pass on the applicants. Men who have had experience in lending money on farm property are serving on Advisory Loan Committees, judging land values.

But even such practical assistance is not enough. In each community farmers can be of real service to the soldier settler. They can give him advice about local conditions. They can lend him an extra horse or plough, give him a day's help at seeding or harvest time, and extend to him that friendly, neighborly, respectful spirit which he deserves.

In this way Canada is performing a double duty. It is discharging, as far as possible, the debt we owe to our soldiers; and it is adding to the country's chief industry a body of competent, willing producers.
