Another angle rarely considered is the fact that local merchants as a whole are carrying on! their books \$200,000.00 all the time in credit accounts. Some people pay in one month, others take twelve months. These people only buy in town when they want it charged. When they have the money it is sent out of town. They pay the mail order house cash before they get the goods. If local merchants had the cash before they supplied the goods, they would be in a much better position to buy in larger quantities and so give better prices.

No mail order house, will give credit, they insist on the money before they part with the goods, but a Rupert Mother and her many sisters demand credit and sometimes a very long credit from the local stores.

The local merchant is a necessity in the community, a convenience and is used and very much abused.
