SPORT CHAT

Canada has won her place in the league of sporting nations by her grand showing at the Olympic Sports. Williams' double success stamps the Vancouver boy as the outstanding runner of the world. The German Kornig whom he beat in the 200 metres race was sprint champion at the English Amateur Athletic Association's Championships last year and this year was second in both the 100 yards and the 220 yards at the same meet. The Canadian's showing is all the more creditable when one considers how few chances he has had of competing with first class runners from other countries.

The victory of S. J. M. Atkinson the South African in the 100 metre hurdles was indicated by his win of the 120 yards at the Amateur Athletic Association Championships at London last month. At that meeting he ran the 120 yards hurdles in 14 and 7-10 seconds which was 1-10 better than the previous British record jointly held by E. J. Thompson of Canada and Lord Burghley. Thompson holds the World's record of 14 and 2-5 seconds for 120 yards hurdles. It is difficult to say what there is in the atmosphere of the Dominion to produce champion hurdlers.

The Muldoon-Tunney Trophy for the heavy-weight boxing championship will be well looked after. A committee of twenty-six is appointed as custodians. There may be safety in numbers but it really needs only one man at present to hold it against all comers, and he is the donor of it.

When the twenty-six disagree will the matter be referred to Tunney, and will he make his decision as a boxer or as a student? He could more emphatically make the former decision one that no member would want to question.

Terminals' prospects of winning the City League for the third year in succession are brighter as a result of their win over the Thistles on Tuesday evening. But the league championship is not lost nor won yet. The Regiment team is still figuring on showing that a poor start is not fatal. The boys are out to capture the league championship too and will show no favoritism. How popular they were with the Thistles when they beat Terminals 3-0 a week ago. And how popular the soldiers will be with the Thistles if they beat the Thistles tomorrow evening. Altogether it would seem that the Regiment is the most popular team in town—I wonder.
