Mr. Davies wrote that at a meeting of the Vancouver Island Boxing Association held at Duncan on Saturday night, March 10, he was instructed to communicate with the Victoria Police Board and endeavor to have it appoint a local boxing commission, composed of experienced business men, who would have full control of boxing here. He pointed out that boxing commissions were in existence in practically every large city on the continent and they had done wonderful work in helping keep the sport clean. Police Commissioner William White supported the suggestion; declaring he believed that a boxing commission should be created in Victoria. He inquired whether the Police Commission or the City Council had the power to form such a body. Chief of Police John Fry said he saw no objection to a boxing commission, stating: "I think it would help these things along." He asserted that such a commission would have to come to the Police Board to secure authority to put on boxing shows, and that such tournaments would be held under
