

JAPANESE FREIGHTER DUE TOMOR-ROW AND WILL COMPLETE IN VANCOUVER

Aboard the Japanese freighter Yogen Maru, due at Triple Island about 6 o'clock tomorrow morning and arriving in the harbor later in the day, the first grain of the season to the Orient from Prince Rupert will be shipped. Vacant, unreserved, surveyed rown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age. and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, condidonal upon residence, occapation, and improvement for agricultural

only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be

received. For more detailed information see the Bulletin "How to Pre-empt

PURCHASE

Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin Lease of Crown Lands."

GRAZING


