ELY RUSSELL WELL ON HIS NORTHERN TRIP

Reached Ketchikan in 30 Running
Hours and Expected to Be in
Juneau for 4th.

A few weeks ago George Ely Russell passed through this city on the first lap of a round the world tour, travelling in an 18-foot Peterboro' canoe "Wanderer II," from Seattle to St. Michael. Mr. Russell stopped here for a short time and made a number of friends who have since heard of his whereabouts. A journalist and philanthropist, he is out in search of local color for a book which will be written on his travels and also a love of adventure spurs him on. He says that while rowing along he has the time to think of things to which the ordinary man does not give a moment's consideration. For many hours at a stretch he has to row along with his back to the wind in order to get to shelter before the approaching storm or before darkness settles.

After leaving Prince Rupert the "Wanderer" made the 105 miles to Ketchikan in 30 running hours distributed over four days. The first day out he went far past Port Simpson and at midnight had 45 miles to his credit. During the next three days while on the way to Ketchikan Mr. Russell came across several fishing outfits and squatters, stopping long enough to get their point of view and what they considered to be the greatest thing in life. All this vast knowledge of human nature will be employed in his book in order to give a true to life tone to the work.

After spending a day in Ketchikan Mr. Russell proceeded on his way into the ever changing scenery of the north and expected to reach Juneau for July Fourth.

ALFRED CUDDY IS NEW POLICE CHIEF OF ALBERTA PROVINCE
