SPLENDID GARDENS AT DIGBY HOSPITAL

Fruit, Flowers and Vegetables at Quarantine Station Look Very Promising.

It is now eight years since Mr. and Mrs. James Smith took charge of the quarantine hospital at Digby. At that time the place was rough and unbroken as regards a garden. How marked a contrast there is today, and especially at this time as the flowers are growing so beautifully all around the grounds. The lilacs are in the height of their bloom whilst fox gloves and columbines are blooming profusely in various corners of the garden. All along one side of the house the pansies are flowering and the stocks, asters and dahlias are already well up from the ground and will soon be bearing blossom.

In the back garden the vegetables are more advanced than in the local gardens. Lettuce, cabbage, carrots and onions are very large and would soon be fit for market. The potato tops are about a foot above the earth. As for the fruit trees an excellent crop is promised especially raspberries. The strawberries are fast ripening and with a little more sun will be ready to be served on the table. The whole scene is a very great encouragement to people who think that nothing can be grown in Prince Rupert.

WHALE ORION HITS UNCHARTED ROCK AT QUEEN CHARLOTTE

The whaler Orion is now at Esquimalt undergoing repairs to damage caused by hitting an uncharted rock off the Queen Charlotte Harbor. Three plates will have to be renewed, while two others will have to be taken off, straightened, and put back again.

The whaling tender Gray is at Victoria. She took on whale meat at the Grand Trunk dock, and will take the cargo to Tacoma. The boat has just returned to Victoria from Ladysmith, where she coalled.

PRISONER SOLDIERS ELIGIBLE FOR AWARDS

Ottawa, July 10.—Officers and men of the Canadian expeditionary forces who displayed gallantry while escaping or attempting to escape from the enemy, or who rendered exceptional service while prisoners of war or interned, are eligible for awards, it is announced.

PRINCE RUPERT WATERFRONT LEASE
