Vic Foley is to make another effort to take the featherweight championship from Kid Roy and he also may have another mix with Bud Taylor at Chicago.

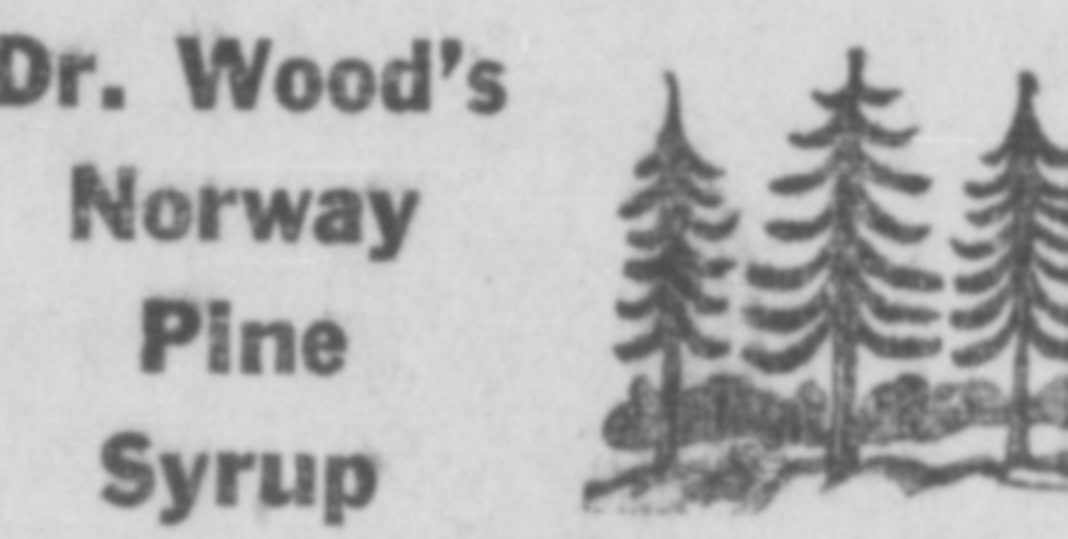

BOTH NEW YORK TEAMS BEATEN

YANKEES LOSE LEADERSHIP OF AMERICAN LEAGUE TO CLEVELAND INDIANS

(Special to Daily News) NEW YORK, April 20.—New York Yankees lost their first game of the season in a double-header with Boston yesterday, letting the Cleveland Indians, who continued their winning streak with another easy victory over the Chicago White Sox, climb to the top of the standing. Washington Senators, who with the Philadelphia Athletics were idle yesterday, share second position with the Yankees. Detroit Tigers defeated the St. Louis Browns and advanced to the head of the second division.

New York Giants, though defeated in a tight game by the lowly Bostonians, manage to retain the lead in the National League by a narrow margin over the St. Louis Cardinals who defeated Pittsburgh Pirates, now sharing the cellar with Boston, in a batting bee. The Cincinnati Reds fell to pieces and were shut out 13 to 0 by the Chicago Cubs who are now in third place. Philadelphia won a 500 percentage along with Brooklyn and Cincinnati by defeating the Dodgers.

RUTH'S FIRST HOMER NEW YORK, April 20.—(Canadian Press)—Babe Ruth hit his first homer of the season in the fifth inning of the afternoon double-header at Boston. There was no one on bases, the Barabino being first up.
