Dominion is to Give a Million Dollars to Construct New Highway

North and South to be Connected by Road From Golden to Mount Robson With Federal Aid

7 ICTORIA, March 29 .- Construction of an automobile highway up the big bend of the Columbia River from Golden to Mount British Columbia to Aiberta and open up the vast mineral and timber areas, will be undertaken by the British Columbia government in co-operation with the Federal government. Announcement to this effect was made by the Times here last evening.

The paper says it has learned that this scheme is part of a federal government program which is expected to include the taking over of Mount Robson and Mount Assiniboine Parks from the province.

Ottawa proposes to spend nearly a million dollars in assisting the province to construct the highway, the Times says.
