BOAT HOUSE IS REMOVED

Marking the formal taking over of the property, the B.C. Towing & Lightering Co. (now to be named the Prince Rupert Towing & Salvage Co. Ltd.) yesterday towed the boat house and floats of the Prince Rupert Boat House down from the location at the foot of McBride Street, alongside the wharf, and floats of the B.C. Towing & Lightering Co. The new concern is negotiating for eighty additional feet of waterfront adjoining the present holding on the east and it is planned to move the floats of the Canadian National Yacht Club slightly east to make room therefor.

The Prince Rupert Towing & Salvage Co. is already operating the boats of the Prince Rupert Boat House.

JUDGE IS LANDLORD OF DEFENDANT AND CANNOT TRY CASE

NET EARNINGS OF RAILWAY

OTTAWA, April 12.—Having regard to the various factors relating to the system's general results, the year's operations may be considered satisfactory, says Sir Henry Thornton in a report covering the 1927 operations of the Canadian National tabled in the House today by Hon. Charles Dunning.

The net earnings were less by \$5,790,000 than for 1926 but much higher than in any previous year.

Gross earnings exceeded those of 1926 by \$3,199,059 or 1.26 per cent. The increase was not in proportion to the increase in operating expenses, partly on account of the reduced rates, early harvest of 1926 and late harvest of 1927.

Operating expenses exceeded those of 1926 by about \$8,989,000 or 4.37 per cent, represented substantially by the

increase in wages and in maintenance of way and structures.
