NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Republicans swept the country yesterday in the greatest outpouring of ballots hown in the history of the United States. Not only was Lumber Ordered for Construction Hoover elected president and Charles Curtis vice-presi- Near Jap Inlet on Porcher dent but the Republican control of the next Congress seems assured.

For the Democrats it was a landslide. They failed to make expected gains in New England and in the midde west while their old supremacy south of the Mason-Dixon line was severely challenged.

Hoover was this morning leading in all states except a bloc in the deep south and in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. The Republicans made gains in both the Senate and House of Representatives. Smith lost his own state of New York but Hoover carried his home state of Cal-

Roosevelt for Governor and Copeland for U.S. Senator ran ahead of Smith in New York state and are leading their Republican opponents for these offices. Six Democratic seats were won by Republicans in Kentucky, Hoover running ahead in the corn belt and border states. Incomplete returns this morning show Hoover states as


