PLEA FOR A GYMNASIUM

As everyone knows, the intended object of the present day educational system is to train boys and girls to become useful citizens and also to equip them, so that they may more easily surmount the obstacles which they will encounter through life. Is it not, however, perhaps even more important to possess a strong, healthy body? What benefit can a person expect to derive from a good education, if he be a physical weakling? If everyone who graduated from High School or College possessed a great store of knowledge, but otherwise was nothing but a walking skeleton, all the students would die off within ten years, and all their knowledge with them. In order to prevent this, a certain amount of athletic training is necessary; and the most opportune time for this is during the period of high school attendance. In Prince Rupert, however, owing to the somewhat damp climate, much of this athletic activity has, of necessity, to be carried on indoors, and consequently a suitable building ought to be found in order to provide an opportunity for the physical development of the students.


By far the simplest remedy for this problem, is to build a High School Gymnasium. The expense would not be great, as a simple wooden structure is all that would be required, its size being sufficient to allow room for the playing of basketball and perhaps indoor baseball or other such sports.

Some may argue that we already have the equivalent of a gymnasium, in that we have the use of the Exhibition Building. In many respects, the Exhibition Building is as good as a High School Gymnasium would be, but a High School Gymnasium has certain marked advantages which cannot be ignored. One of these is that instead of having the use of a recreation hall for a certain apportioned time only during each week, we might have the use of our own gymnasium every day of the week, without any inconvenience to ourselves, or to anybody else. This would give much more time and opportunity for athletic development and would also render it much easier to carry on a basketball schedule during the winter months.

Another point is that the gymnasium, being near the school, would be easily accessible, and would save long tramps up the hill through the rain to the Exhibition Building.

The gain resultant from this physical training would not only be to build up the students physically, but also mentally, and thus the standard of their school work would be greatly raised.

Past students have given us a library, a tennis court and many other things, of which we are making full use at the present. It should not be our part to sit idly by and enjoy the comforts which they have obtained through persistent efforts, and with great difficulty, for us! It is our part to show that we, also, have that traditional industrious spirit of our predecessors, by building the thing which is most needed by this school at the present time, a gymnasium!
