

Coal Mine Stoppage Increases Unemployment but This Dwindles to 1,240,550

LONDON, Jan 12.—That a considerable number of young men in the United Kingdom who are receiving relief from the Poor Law Guardians marry and thus add to the amount of money they receive in Poor Law relief is pointed out in the annual report of the Ministry of Health for 1926-27. The report states:

"It is commonly supposed that Poor Law relief is available only to meet the existing necessities of persons who have become destitute, and it is not generally realized that during the past six years numbers of young men without employment and maintained on Poor Law relief have married, securing thereby an increase in their income from relief, and have had families, each addition bringing its addition to the family income. The great increase is attributed largely to the effects of the industrial disputes. The estimated total expenditure on Poor Law relief during the year under review was £49,500,000, as compared with a total expenditure of £40,083,455 in 1925-26.

The dominant feature of the year under review was the increase of pauperism resulting from the coal mining stoppage and the general strike. During the whole year the weekly number of persons in receipt of relief averaged 1,930,841, equivalent to 496 per 10,000 of the population of the country, as compared with 1,207,302, or 312 per 10,000 of the population in 1925-26.

From August 14 the numbers steadily declined, until on December 11 the total fell below 2,000,000 for the first time since May 8, and afterwards the numbers continued to decrease each week to March 26, 1927, when the figure was 1,-240,550, a net increase of only 460 compared with the numbers on the corresponding date in 1925-26.

Opponents of Carlisle System Say it is Unfair and Leads to Socialism

LONDON, Eng., Jan. 13.—The system of state liquor control, which has been in force in the Carlisle area for some years, is being threatened. Protests against its continuance have been received by the Home Secretary, Sir William Joynson-Hicks, from the Carlisle Conservative Association, which is seeking the support of similar associations in making this protest.

Briefly, the system in operation in Carlisle consists of the substitution of the "improved" type of inn for the old time "pub." The chief features are that Capitol, 2nd grade, lb. 45c good food at reasonable prices is as available as is mere liquor, and the lecensee's interest in the sales effected is confined to the eatables.

The local Conservative Association scheme is a form of nationalization which is contrary to Conservative principles, and a source of danger to the trading community throughout the whole country, since in the event of a Socialist Government being returned to power it is feared the scheme would be extended to the whole country, and that such extension would entail the inauguration of factories for manufacture by the state, as well as the actual liquor itself. "As it exists in the Carlisle area today," the protest states. "it has already entered into unfair and unequal competition with private interests outside the liquor trade, whom it undercuts in price. Further, it competes with manufacturers of temperance beverages, some of whom it has already forced out of business.
