**DEATH WAS
ACCIDENTAL**

FURTHER DETAILS RECEIVED OF
TRAGEDY WHICH TOOK STEPHEN
MIDDLETON'S LIFE LAST
WEEK

J. S. Wilson returned to the city on yesterday afternoon's train from the interior where he was called on account of the death of Stephen Middleton, section foreman at Knockholt and cousin of Mrs. Wilson, who was killed in a railway accident near Houston last Tuesday night.

The coroner's jury at Smithers before Coroner Stephen H. Hoskins returned a verdict of accidental death. It was late in the evening of last Tuesday when deceased and three companions set out from Houston aboard a speeder on their return to Knockholt after having registered some mineral claims. On the curve of the railway just east of Houston, they saw a freight locomotive approaching them on the track about 150 feet distant. While assisting in removing the speeder from the track, Middleton was struck by the locomotive and death was instantaneous, his head being smashed with two broken jaws and a fracture of the skull while a shoulder bone and leg above the knee were also broken.

**PRICE IS SET UPON
OLD POWER MACHINES**
One Generator From Former Cow Bay Steam Plant Sold To Stewart Company

On recommendation of the utilities committee, the city council decided last night to set a price of \$3,000 on two old engines and generators which are lying unused near Cow Bay, having formerly formed a part of the equipment of the old steam plant. Ald. Brown explained that an offer had been made for this machinery but had been considered too low. It was deemed advisable to put a price on it now in case purchasers should offer.

On recommendation of the utilities committee, the council accepted an offer from the International Electric Co. of Stewart of \$500 for a 100 kilowatt generator which was formerly used in the Cow Bay plant. Ald. Brown expressed the opinion that this was a fair price for this particular piece of equipment which was not included in the previous \$3,000.

**CINDER WALK ON
BORDEN STREET
TO BE CUT DOWN**

A recommendation of the Board of Works that a cinder path be built along the north side of Borden Street, which is being graded, to connect with the old walk to Borden Street School was adopted by the city council last night. The putting down of the walk was urged by the school board and the recommendation of the Board of Works followed.

Ald. Collart, stated that he had been approached by a number of citizens who had asked for walk on the south side of street. Now they were willing to have the sidewalk but they were not willing to pay for it. The contour of the ground, he said, would lend itself well to a cinder walk. If a walk on the south side of the street were asked for later, it could be put in.

**CITY ENGINEER TO
BE GIVEN ORDERS**

Lack of Co-Operation With Medical Health Officer Alleged By Aid. Tinker

Difficulties having been reported by Aid. Tinker, the city council decided last night that there would have to be better co-operation by the engineer's department with the medical health officer in the matter of making sanitary inspections.

Ald. Tinker stated that, under an arrangement with the city engineer the medical health officer was supposed to have a certain man to make inspections when necessary. However, the doctor had been unable to get this man on occasions when he was required. Aid. Tinker felt that the inspections should be carried out regularly, say once or twice a week. Some of the lanes were getting in bad shape and there was a swarm of rats around the city dump.

Ald. Prudhomme stated that the city engineer had been instructed to give the health officer this man when he was needed. Those instructions were not being carried out, replied Aid. Tinker.

Ald. Collart felt that it should be made plain to the city engineer that this man was first at the disposal of the medical health officer. He would so move.

Ald. Prudhomme feared that such a motion might be the thin edge of the wedge toward the creation of another official. He advised that the matter be left with the department and felt sure that there would be no further complaint.

The mayor felt that the medical health officer should make any complaints he had to the Board of Works. He would see the city engineer, however, and give him to understand that the man in question must be available whenever the medical health officer required him.

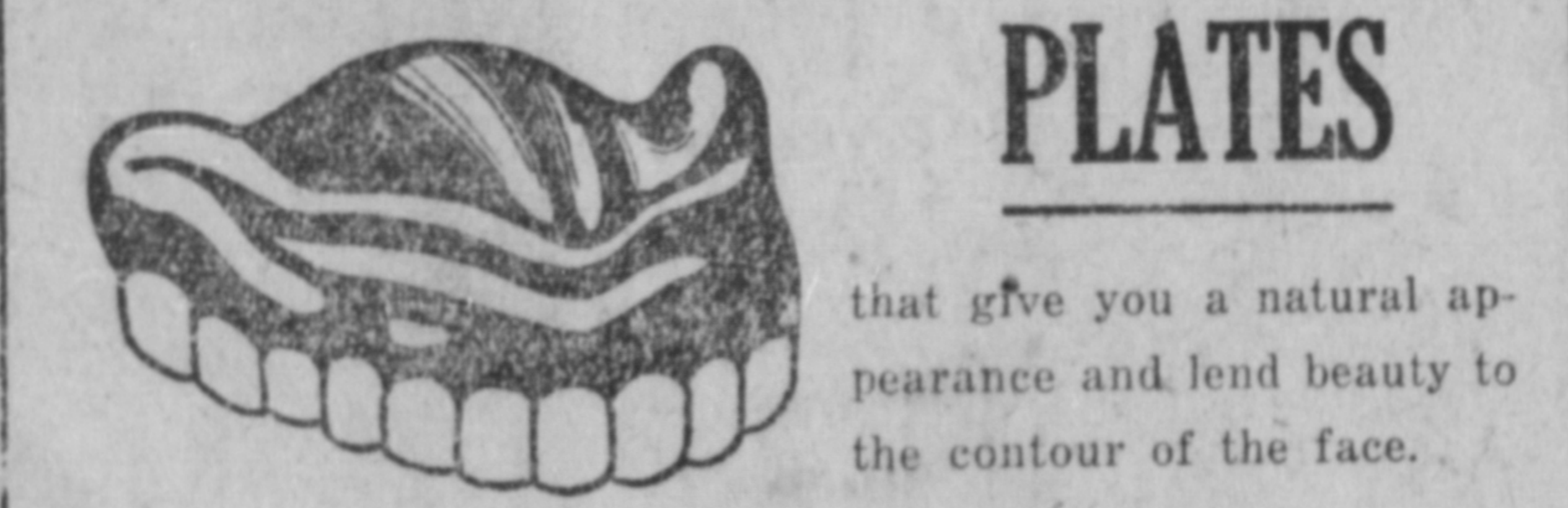
