MUCH BUILDING IN THE CITY

First Dwelling Under the Returned Soldiers Housing Scheme Has Been Started.

The first house to be built under the returned soldiers' housing scheme is now under way on Sixth Avenue near the Canadian Steam Laundry. The building is being put up by J. H. Kelly and will cost about \$2,500. It is a two-storey building with a flat roof. Full particulars have not yet been given to the city hall and further approval must be made by the board in Victoria.

There are numerous other buildings going up about the city and more will soon be started. The basement work on Harry Atkins' house has just been begun on Fourth Avenue. A few concrete piers are being put in place to carry the rear of the building. The front of the house rests on the solid rock.

One especially large building will be started in a few days on Third Avenue and Seventh Street for Wm. Beveridge. There will be a large store on the ground floor and residential flats on the second storey. Everything will be finished in truly modern style and the block will prove a decided improvement to that part of the city. The cost is in the neighborhood of \$4,500.

Small Cottages.

Building is not taking place in the down town sections alone, for many are building residences in the outside parts of the city. Across the creek especially in the neighborhood of the drydock and the cold storage there are many small cottages and bungalows going up. Mr. Ed. Davidson of the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Company, Ltd., is going to build a house on Eighth Avenue near the Seal Cove school. The plan shows the building to be one and a half storeys and will cost \$1,500.

Section Two also seems to be coming in for its own in the building line. J. C. Brady, the principal of the high school, is going to build a house on a lot which he has recently acquired here. It is just across the Section Two bridge and only a short distance from the town. The structure is valued at \$2,500.

ALICE ARM

Rev. Leversedge and wife brought the Busy Bee girls from Anyox for a week's camping out, trip in the vicinity of Alice Arm.

Work is progressing on the erection of loading chutes at the Dolly Varden dock for handling the ore from cars to boats.

The railroad has been cleared of slides and power is now able to reach the end of steel where work is rapidly progressing laying the last two miles of track.

The Taco arrived Friday with steel rails. As soon as discharged will make a trip to Stewart.

There is great need of a public wharf at Alice Arm, all the business for this place now being handled over the Dolly Varden wharf with its limited facilities for handling and storage. This was discussed at a meeting of the Commercial Club on Thursday evening and it was decided to put the matter before the proper government officials with the view to having a dock erected as early as practicable to afford the necessary relief.
