**TRAGEDY AND COMEDY AT THE WESTHOLME**

Private Peat Shows First Fighting of America's Troops in Great War.

At the Westholme Theatre tonight Private Peat will be shown again for the benefit of the Prince Rupert movie-goers. On the field of battle the setting is particularly fine and the search light playing over the ground as the Allies advance gives a wonderful effect. Particularly interesting is the piece of paper on which is printed a map showing the position of the rival armies. The lines appear in red. These pamphlets were scattered as propaganda matter behind the German lines in September, 1918.
