### AQUARIUM FOR TOURISTS URGED

Canon Rushbrook Tells Some of the Interesting Phases of Marine Life Which May Be Seen

SQUID FIFTY FEET LONG

Endless Variety of Beautiful Creatures Inhabit Waters on This Region and May Be Studied

That Prince Rupert holds a unique position for the study of marine life and that the enjoyment of making a study of some of the many forms that present themselves here is something that should be taken advantage of by local people, is the opinion of Canon W. F. Rushbrook, who addressed the Rotary Club yesterday afternoon at its regular weekly luncheon in the Commodore Cafe.

Canon Rushbrook explained that the marine life here was semi-tropical in character, very different from similar latitudes on the Atlantic coast. The waters are rich in the various species of polyps, some of them being gems of beauty. He also spoke of the medusas, some with hair 15 to 20 feet long.

Speaking of the squids which are found on the coast, the speaker mentioned one that was seen about three years ago near the mouth of the Naas River some 50 feet long and with a lateral expansion of possibly 75 feet. He himself had seen one that was 37 feet long and with a sac large enough for him to climb into. He mentioned the endless variety of crabs, from the giant wonderfully formed king crab and the spider crabs to the little hermit crabs found on the beach.

Canon Rushbrook enthused over the wonderful variety of game fish, from the 100-pound spring salmon to the pugnacious little member of the cod family which was able to sink itself when pursued and attach itself to the rocks so that it was impossible to tear it away. He suggested that some of these forms should be exhibited on the local docks in aquaria to be established there. It would be one of the greatest attractions for visitors that could possibly be established here.

The great flotillas of Spanish men-of-war that sometimes invaded these waters, little jellyfish with miniature sails which come from the south. There are all sorts of interesting things which bring unending delight and the speaker urged the possibilities for study under ideal conditions.

### COAST INDIANS AND DRUIDS OF GREAT BRITAIN

Ethnic Relation Close, Declares Canon Rushbrook in Address Yesterday

That the natives of this coast were ethnically related to the Druids, who were the early inhabitants of Britain, is indicated by their use of the sun as an emblem of worship and a sign used on their coffins and in some of their rock carvings was an opinion expressed by Canon Rushbrook, in the course of his address to the Rotary Club at its luncheon yesterday afternoon. Canon Rushbrook urged preservation of some of the drawings and other mementoes of the original native life here.

Canon Rushbrook referred specifically to the carving of the man who fell from heaven on the rocks in Metlakatla Passage and carving of the sun on a point nearby. He prophesied that some of the local carved rocks would some day be stolen and carried away to museums. They were very wonderful and valuable. Formerly there were mummies and coffins in the caves of the neighborhood, but they had been all taken away. At the end of every coffin was the red circle representing diety. It was also used as a decoration on oolichan boxes. They were closely related to the Drudic circles in Britain. The speaker mentioned that the

Indians of the past were perfectly self-contained and not without art, as seen in the making of the beautiful canoes which they used and which were on similar lines to the ocean liners of today, giving the maximum speed with the minimum resistance. They also knew the uses of spaghnum moss for wrappings for the young children, of herbal purgatives and hellbore as a germicide. They were equal to every occasion. Men and women were able to meet the exigencies of life and he hoped the records of the ancient past would be preserved.
