## News of the Mines

AROUND PRINCE RUPERT

Another Property at Topley Claims Attention; Van-Glacier Gulch Showing Up Well  
Glacier Showing Up Well

A new and what is said to be an extremely rich strike of ore has been made on the Topley group of claims, located a mile south of the Topley Richfield and owned by Matthew Sam, an Indian prospector. This ore shows in a distinct vein running at right angles to previous discoveries on the property and on the surface there is six inches of clean ore. Recently some work has been done by way of open cuts and these have yielded such promising

results that it is now the intention to drop down into a ravine and run a drift tunnel. The group has been owned by Matthew Sam for several years and is now ready for crown granting. The ore is said to resemble that now being taken from the shaft on the Topley Silver property, silver being the main value. A vein 18 inches wide has given values of 640 ounces silver, \$1.20 in gold and 4.2 per cent copper.

The Guardian Stock and Bond Association of Vancouver is reported to have taken a bond on the Comet group of claims on Four-Mile Mountain, near Hazelton, which was formerly owned by James Dyer, T. B. Lewis, M.E., has been retained to draw up a program of development, and for the present this will comprise a cross-cut tunnel to be driven approximately 240 feet to reach an intersection of several fissures. In view of recent important discoveries of high-grade on the Mohawk, which the Comet adjoins, the prospects ahead of the latter property are said to be very bright for encountering the same class of mineral. Operations will be carried on by a small force during the winter and, should conditions warrant the expenditure, larger camps may be erected and development undertaken on an increased scale.

With several samples assaying an average of over \$20 to the ton, Frank H. Taylor, who recently took an option on the Glacier Gulch mining property, near Smithers, is preparing plans for the installation of machinery which will allow of more speedy development. Operations on the Glacier Gulch at present consist of a shaft sunk on a lead which penetrated some excellent ore. This is now down approximately 16 feet and there is 16 inches of solid mineral composed of lead, zinc and arsenophyrite carrying strong values in gold and silver. At present there is only a small crew employed on the work, but Mr. Taylor states that he has two complete compressor plants available and one of these may soon be utilized in hurrying along the development in the shaft, which will be followed later by a tunnel.

A mining engineer is reported to have recently made an examination of mineral properties at Pacific and Cedarvale on behalf of the Payne-Whitney interests of New York and Winnipeg who are establishing the Flin Flon mine in Northern Manitoba.

Harry Heywood managing director of the Terminus Mines Ltd. has been on a trip to Trail recently to meet officials of the Consolidated Mining & Smelting Co. which it is reported may take over the property at Stewart. A small crew is being employed throughout the winter in underground work on the property. A crosscut is being driven to No. 2 vein which will be explored at depth after it is encountered.

The management of the Marmot River Gold announces that there is no truth to a rumor that the property is being shut down. It is the intention of the board of directors to carry on development all winter. Development work is proceeding with very encouraging results.

During the past few months mining in the Anyox-Alice Arm district has been making great strides says the Alice Arm Herald in reviewing the situation. Besides its major operations at Anyox, the Granby Co. is developing the Bonanza mine which will start pouring a steady stream of ore into the Anyox concentrator next spring. The company has also optioned 14 claims adjoining

the Big Hidden Creek mine and is reopening the Granby Point property. On Hastings Arm, the Silver Crest have won the admiration of all. At Alice Arm several companies have been operating throughout the summer. The Toric is now firmly established as a shipping mine. The Utility Mining & Financing Co. is developing the Tiger with unusual success and the erection of a mill next year is already planned. The Kitsault-Eagle Silver Mines Ltd. has located ore on the Eagle and has considerably increased the tonnage on the Silver Cord, being now engaged in driving a 1000-foot tunnel on the Sunrise. The Esperanza Mining Co. has increased its working force and will operate throughout the coming winter. Plans are being formulated to organize a strong company to operate the Homegard group next summer. The Mohawk will also be operated next year the company being formed for the purpose and it is understood that the LaRose, too, will open up again. Negotiations are also proceeding for the taking over of several groups of claims in the Alice Arm district by mining companies. Almost every week reports are published of expansion of operations of local companies or the formation of new companies who will enter the field next spring. The district is forging ahead and the expansion promises to increase each year as the vast mineral wealth becomes more widely known.
