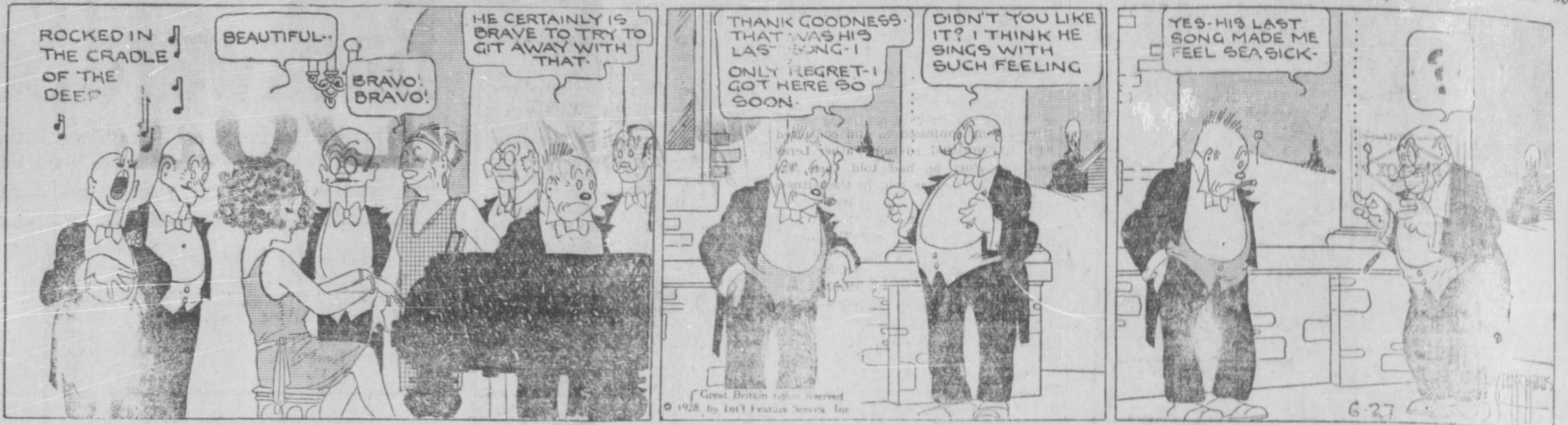

MORE ABOUT GOLD STRIKE

SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT OF NEWS TELLS OF FIND AT GRANBY BAY

ALICE ARM, June 28.—The facts in regard to the new gold strike on Granby Bay are as follows: Construction work is being carried on by the Granby Co. at their Bonanza property on Bonanza Creek. Two of the workmen—Ralph Ingraham and John McCallum—one evening broke some rock in an outcropping of quartz not far from the camp. This showed free gold. Further prospecting showed that this quartz ledge could be traced over a distance of several hundred feet. Some specimens of the rock showed a fairly rich mineralization of free gold. It is understood here that the greater portion of the ledge as uncovered is located on the Granby holdings of the Bonanza property.
