CROP REPORT BETTER BUT STILL POOR

Small Crops May be Reaped Where None Was Expected Two Weeks Ago.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)

Regina, July 15.—The Provincial Department of Agriculture today issued a crop report received from telegraphic correspondence from all parts of the province. The reports seem to indicate that conditions are much more favorable than reported in the last bulletin two weeks ago. Early sown grain would appear to have suffered most from the heat. Recent rains, however, have brought on the later sown grain and in many places where two weeks ago it was not considered possible that they would harvest a crop, it is now possible that five bushels to the acre will be reaped.

The best crops are in the east, centre and northern part of the southeastern district. The whole of the western part of the province, as far north as the Saskatchewan River, will have to import feed for the stock for the coming winter and many farmers will not have enough seed for next year.

MOVIES FOR THE ESKIMOS

Expedition to the North Takes Machine and Films to Show Aborigines.

New York, July 15.—Moving pictures for the Eskimos are to play an important part in the Arctic expedition which left here under the direction of Christian Leden, Arctic explorer and ethnologist. Mr. Leden will show the Eskimos moving pictures of how the white man lives and hopes in this way to win his interest in a trade scheme which the expedition expects to be developed.

The explorer and four companions sailed on an auxiliary yacht and expect to remain in the frozen north several months. In addition to a cargo of lumber with which to build houses, the yacht carries sundry cargo odds and ends for trading purposes in return for which the explorer hopes to obtain gold, copper and other minerals.

ALLIED ATTACK ON BELA KUN EXPECTED TO BEGIN AT ONCE

London, July 16.—Gen. Franchet Desperrey, the French commander in the Near East with the Allies against Bela Kun, Hungarian soviet leader, according to an exchange telegraph despatch. The Allied attack was expected to begin at once.
