

REPORT MADE OF TAXATION

Commission Appointed by Province of Alberta Makes Recommendations

EDMONTON, Feb. 27.—Imposition of a provincial income tax and increase of the gasoline tax from three to five cents are important recommendations in the report on the whole question of revenue and taxation in Alberta submitted by Dr. H. M. Tory, president of the University of Alberta and chairman of the special committee appointed by the legislature to deal with the subject. The report was tabled in the legislature Tuesday afternoon by Hon. R. G. Reid, provincial treasurer and minister of municipal affairs.

The committee sitting with Dr. Tory included, A. A. Carpenter, chairman of the board of public utilities commissioners; Edward Pinchbeck, secretary-municipal districts association; A. T. Stephenson, city commissioner; Red Deer, and A. H. Towell, manager of the provincial Hall insurance board. Robert English, deputy minister of municipal affairs, acted as secretary, and James C. Thompson, provincial auditor, served in an advisory capacity.

The committee recommends:

1—Imposition of a provincial income tax.

2—Increase in gasoline tax from three to five cents a gallon.

3—Repeal of the Supplementary Revenue Tax, and substitution of a Public Revenue Act.

4—Collection of all taxes on natural resources by provincial government, if resources are returned to the province.

5—Enforcement of Liquor Act pro-
