

RAILWAY RATES ARE DISCUSSED

Whole Question of Traffic Between U. S. and Canada Being Discussed.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 10.—The Interstate Commerce Commission is sitting here today to hear arguments in a case which involves the whole question of freight rates on traffic between Canada and the United States. The case arises out of a decision of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, upholding an Interstate Commerce Commission ruling that when American railroads collected alleged excessive rates on traffic originating in another country the said railroads must assume full responsibility for the rebate paid to the American consignee.

The question has been raised from time to time and now is to be thrashed out by the Interstate Commerce Commission which, it is understood, will eventually consult with the board of railway commissioners for Canada on the subject. The Canadian Railway board will not be represented at the Washington hearing but will await the decision of the American Board. The Canadian Manufacturers' Association and both the Canadian railroads will be represented at the Washington hearing but the Canadians will probably take no part in the discussions.

After the United States Circuit Court of Appeals had upheld the ruling of the Interstate Commission, several questions were submitted by the New York Central Railroad Company and the Pennsylvania Railroad Company to the Supreme Court of the United States. Mr. Justice Butler brought down the judgment on behalf of the Supreme Court to the effect that although the railroad in a foreign country may have participated in the making of a rate which had been later judged excessive, the American road alone came within the jurisdiction of the American Interstate Commerce Act and that when the American road collected the excessive charges the claim could be made solely against the United States carrier. Mr. Justice Butler also ruled that when the American road collected the excessive charges the claim could be made solely against the United States carrier.

The whole case came up when the News Syndicate Company laid claim against the two American railroads for excess charges which they claimed the railroads had collected on news print from Thorold, Ontario to American points prior to July 1, 1922, at which date the rate was reduced by the Interstate Commerce Commission.
