Smuggler Followed by Americans Until 200 Miles Off Coast and Then Scuttled; Captain Defies the Invaders

NEW ORLEANS, March 25 .- The crew of the British schooner Imalone, sunk by the coast guard patrol boat's gun fire in the Gulf of Mexico 200 miles off the Louisiana shore, landed here last night.

The men were manacled and under a heavy guard when brought ashore. They were permitted to talk only to United States officials and the British vice-consul. The coast guard officers reported the Imalone at anchor 10 or 11

CALL MONEY ADVANCE SENDS NEW YORK STOCKS TOBOGGANING, WASHING AWAY MILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN QUOTED VALUES

NEW YORK, March 25—A storm of selling orders poured into the stock exchange today, washing away millions of dollars in quoted values and sending nearly two score railroad and industrial shares to new low levels for the year. The declines in active issues ranged from \$2 to \$10 a share.
