That puts the authority just where it belongs. If the Police Commissioners recommend that prosecutions shall take place, the law in that respect will be enforced, it is to be presumed. There may be cases where through the pressure of public opinion or for other reasons the attorney-general may go contrary to the opinion of the Police Commissioners, but such a case has not yet arisen, so far as we know.
