## HOT HEELS AT THE WESTHOLME

Entire Picture Permeated With  
Humor is Part of Big Double  
Program Tonight and  
Tomorrow

Glenn Tryon plows his way through a maze of circumstances, both comic and dramatic, extracting every possible laugh from the story of "Hot Heels," the Universal comedy, which is to be seen tonight and tomorrow as part of a big double program at the Westholme.

Although the entire picture is permeated with humor, there are two incidents which stand out as being among the comedy gems of film history. The first of these shows a small town troupe putting on a race track melodrama for an unappreciative and tiny audience. This is pure burlesque, but it touches the funny bone and incidentally gives a rare picture of the real life of one of these "am" troupes.

The other gem is the Apache dance put on by Tryon and Patsy Ruth Miller in which Tryon takes the place of her regular partner. They mean every one of the blows in this strenuous dance, for they have been fighting just previous to the dance. And the audience applauds their efforts soundly. "Hot Heels" is also featured by what is probably the most thrilling steeplechase race ever run for the screen, full of spills, tremendous leaps and dangerous narrow escapes.

## "NIGHT FLYER" DRAMATIC TALE

Picture Seen at Westholme To-night as Part of Big Double Program

The story of "The Night Flyer," part of the big double program at the Westholme tonight, deals with the adventures of Jimmie Bradley, a fireman on a rickety locomotive in the Rocky Mountains in 1894. He loves Kate Murphy, daughter of a woman who keeps the lunch counter at the railroad station. But Mrs. Murphy opposes the match and favors Bat Mullins, a braggart, but also a good engineer with a big salary.

Jimmie writes his declaration of love for Mary in an album, intending to give it to her at a party to be given in her honor. She saves Tony, a brakeman, from injury at the hands of a bunch of roistering cowboys and is himself forced at the muzzle of a revolver, to clumsily drink many glasses of whisky. Jimmie gets tight and goes to the party.

He gives the album to Kate quite unaware that an impudent reference to Kate's nose and freckles had been substituted for his own carefully phrased avowals. Jimmie turns from him and Mrs. Murphy takes advantage of the occasion to announce the engagement of Kate and Bat.

Jimmie is demoted by the division superintendent, but just as the flyer is about to leave town with the mails, it is discovered that Bat's fireman is drunk. Jimmie takes his place in the cab with his rival, as fireman. The train is wrecked, but on a siding stands Jimmie's old engine, "99." He jumps into the cab and brings the mails through in record time, thus insuring the mail contract for his company, and incidentally, he wins promotion and Kate.

## MY KITCHEN NOTEBOOK

### My Secret for Finer-Textured Cakes

I must confess that I haven't always been successful in the making of cake. I suspect that I possessed more zeal than skill—thoroughness rather than definiteness. But when I learned to exercise my beating proclivities at the start in the creaming together of butter and sugar, and to exhibit restraint at the finish by stirring only a moment after the final ingredients were added, my cakes improved.
