X-Ray and Lab Technician In Hospital Here

Having an application from Miss Agnes Johnson of this city, who is at present in North Dakota, for such a position, the hospital board last night discussed the proposal to engage an X-ray and laboratory technician for the Prince Rupert General Hospital and finally left the matter over for the consideration of the 1930 board.

Miss Johnson's application was conveyed to the board by Dr. J. P. Cade, who, in speaking on the matter, explained details of the work which might be carried on and expressed the belief that the hospital would benefit by opening such a department. The medical men of the city were desirous of having it.

Miss Jean Harrison, R.N., while expressing the opinion that it might not pay, felt it would be a valuable adjunct to the hospital and would tend to raise the standing of the institution. It would be necessary, however, to find outside accommodation for the technician, as all space in the Nurses' Home would be taken up with a large class of probationers which was expected in February.

After general discussion by the board the matter was laid over for further consideration.

Hospital Dues System Urged

Board to Seek Further Information On Proposal of Salmon Fisheries Association

Pending further information on the matter being obtained, the hospital board last night deferred its decision on a proposal from the Northern B. C. Salmon Fishermen's Association that a scheme be put into effect whereby salmon fishermen might obtain treatment and use of hospital facilities on the basis of payment of annual or monthly dues to the institution. A letter from Charles Lord, secretary-treasurer of the association, stated that this had been one of the matters taken up at the annual meeting of the association recently. It was pointed out that such a scheme had been in operation for some time in connection with the Port Simpson Hospital. As matters now stood the hospital often lost accounts of fishermen who were unable to pay. If the system of hospital dues were adopted, it might prove a benefit to all concerned.

Dr. J. P. Cade recalled that the ticket system had been tried some years ago by the local hospital, but it had proven a failure and an expense to the hospital. A minimum number of men to come under the scheme would have to be set and a definite period determined. If 100 men signed up to pay dues it might pay the hospital.

Ald. Brown thought the proposal was well worth looking into. He suggested that the matter be left over to next year's board and that, in the meantime, information as to the details of the Port Simpson scheme and as to how many men might sign up locally and for how long be obtained. This suggestion was adopted by the board.


