DAILY MAIL AGAIN ASKED

Edmonton Also Working For Same End and Asks Local Co-operation

At the regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trade last night a letter was read from John Blue, secretary of the Edmonton Board, as follows:

"Our chamber is anxious to establish a daily mail service between Edmonton and Prince Rupert this summer and are taking the matter up with the different towns and points along the railways such as Hazelton, Vanderhoof, Prince George and Prince Rupert.

"We are taking the matter up with Hon. Charles Stewart and K. A. Blatchford, both members for Edmonton and also with the postmaster general.

"We think that it will require concerted action and constant pressure to secure results and if you will enlist your support, as you undoubtedly will, of the federal members in the territory concerned, we have considerable hope that our efforts will be successful.

Prince Rupert board instructed the secretary to again write the department at Ottawa and the local member, drawing attention to previous requests of the board and suggesting that this was the desirable time for the daily mail service to be put into force.

AIDS TO NAVIGATION

At the meeting of the Board of Trade last night J. H. Pillsbury reported that a petition was being signed by masters of vessels playing in these waters asking for aids to navigation. They state that the aids would be of service to the fishing and other small craft as well as to ocean going craft. It was decided to forward this petition to Ottawa.

LIBERALISM PROTEST AT USURPATION

Speaker at Liberal Meeting Shows Fundamental Difference Between Two Parties

"Liberalism is a natural sequel of Toryism. Too few people understand the fundamental difference between Conservatism and Liberalism," declared T. D. Pattullo last night in his address at the Moose Hall. "Historically and fundamentally, Liberalism began as a protest against the usurpation and abuse of authority and power by the few over the many, for the benefit of the few at the expense of the many. The issue has been constantly fought out in sweat and blood over the centuries, and the fight is still in progress—in our country by the pen, in some countries by the sword.

"Many unfamiliar with the principles involved and unmindful of historical fact, see little difference in these so-called modern days between Liberalism and Conservatism.

"While blood is not running in our own country, and while we are enjoying hardly-won rights and privileges denied to many of our contemporaries, the fact is that economically and socially, we can only retain the ground already won by constant vigilance, and attain the goal of general and universal welfare through unremitting effort.

"Speaking in particular, we can illustrate what I mean by surveying our own provincial political and economic atmosphere.

"During the past few months, we have had illustrated in the clearest possible fashion, the difference in viewpoint between Conservatism, as represented by the present provincial government, and Liberalism, as represented by His Majesty's Loyal Opposition.

"In the first place, let me say that the pledges made by the present Prime Minister before July last, have all gone by the board. Policies for which we were so severely criticised are continued, and only recently an Order-in-Council was passed authorizing the Minister of Lands to allow the export of raw logs upon such conditions as he might see fit. Yet upon this very issue, our administration was accused of being in collusion with American interests to the detriment of our great province.

"Whatever we did was treason to our province.

"The present government can follow the same policy and it is patriotic endeavor."

TRACTORS WILL REPLACE HORSE

Modern Development in Connection With Logging For Giscome Mill in Prince George District

Horse transport is to be replaced to a considerable extent by caterpillar transport in connection with the Giscome mill in the Prince George district according to F. W. Shaver who returned recently from a trip of inspection to leading sawmill plants in Southern British Columbia, Washington, Oregon and Idaho.

The Giscome company already has one 60 h.p. ten ton tractor in operation which has been moving a train of from eight to nine sleighs over the road, giving a load of from 40,000 to 50,000 feet of timber, but the chief trouble the tractor has had to contend with has been adverse grades. The present tractor haul is about three miles to points where the logs may be loaded on the cars of the steam railway operated by the company in its logging.

Mr. Shaver is satisfied that logging at Giscome can be handled satisfactorily with the tractor.

GRILSE FISHERS HOLD MEETING

Communicate With Major Motherwell Regard to Southern Fishing

VICTORIA, May 3.—Asking for an explanation of the new rules affecting fishing in British Columbia, interested sportsmen of Victoria will communicate with Major Motherwell, it was decided at a meeting attended by representatives of the west coast canneries, local sporting goods stores and a number of independent fishermen.

The communication will ask Major Motherwell why the regulation of 20 fish per boat per day had been changed to 10 per day and why the maximum had been reduced to five fish per person.

The much discussed question of "Is a Gilse a salmon?" should be cleared up before a new set of rules came into effect, it was stated today. By buying a license for \$1 any individual sportsman can avoid the five fish per man rule, it was said. There should be something done to prevent this, it was agreed.
