It came into being as a result of dissatisfaction with the condition of the local market, it being claimed that the fishermen were not getting a large enough price for their product, considering the price obtained in the east.

If the Association decides to organize and operate in Prince Rupert it is probable that it will i interest itself in the matter of cold storage with a view to getting the fishermen and others to go into it on a co-operative basis.
