MUCH INTEREST IN FALL FAIR

Many New Exhibitors Will Have Products on View—Minerals To Be a Feature.

From the reports of progress given at the directors' meeting Tuesday night in connection with the fair, this year will see the biggest and best fair ever yet held in Prince Rupert. There has been a great demand for space for exhibits, so much so that it was feared that there would be more applicants than space available. Many of these exhibitors have never shown anything at the Prince Rupert fair before and the directors feel gratified with the interest being taken by people outside the city.

Minerals.

The mineral exhibit will be under the charge of the Free Miners League, which has already very many specimens ready. The display at the fair will be kept as a permanent exhibit by the League and as its members are sending in specimens from Skagway to Fort George, a very wide range of ores will be available.

There will be a big band contest, in which all the bands in the district are expected to participate, as the winner will be engaged for the next fair.

It is hoped to secure an aeroplane from the Government which will be handled by the local flying officers, and a steam merry-go-round will also add interest.

The pyrotechnic display of past years it was considered could be improved upon, by, of course, an added expenditure. It was thought that this feature was one which might well be made worth while.

Hospital Auxiliary.

From the applications received for booths outside the exhibition building, nearly all were for the dispensing of refreshments, while the Ladies' Hospital Auxiliaries have requested the space upstairs used in former years by the Red Cross Society for serving teas.

Everything augurs well for the success of the fair this year and the slogan "for a bigger and better fair" is being lived up to.

FOREST FIRES

FISH BUYING ASSOCIATION INVESTIGATE

Capt. Hvattum to Come to Prince Rupert With a View to Establishing.

Seattle, July 24.—It is expected that Capt. Hvattum, manager of the new independent fish association that is controlled by the vessel owners here, will visit Prince Rupert in the near future to look over the ground with a view to establishing there.

The Association was established last spring and has done a good deal of the fish buying here of late. It came into being as a result of dissatisfaction with the condition of the local market, it being claimed that the fishermen were not getting a large enough price for their product, considering the price obtained in the east.

If the Association decides to organize and operate in Prince Rupert it is probable that it will interest itself in the matter of cold storage with a view to getting the fishermen and others to go into it on a co-operative basis.
