During the flight from Fairbanks yesterday the plane encountered several fog banks, compelling a change of course, necessitating landing at Taylor and Drury's Post on Teslin Lake, Yukon, where it refuelled and proceeded to White Horse, arriving at 4 p.m.

The route taken from Atlin to Hazelton will be along the old trail of '98, paralleled by the Yukon telegraph line, which is an inestimable aid in giving weather conditions, and the right-of-way of which is plainly visible, many places acting as good land marks.

### Power Plant Turned in to City as Profit in Eighteen Years Sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars

## POISON GAS TIME OF WAR

Canada One of Nations Which Agrees to Sign Protocol

GENEVA, April 30.-On behalf of Great Britain, Australia, South Africa, New Zealand and the Irish Free State, Lord Cushendun, British under-secretary for foreign affairs, announced in the league's preparatory disarmament commission today that these nations of the Empire would ratify the Geneva protocol of 1925 prohibiting the use of poison gas in war, providing other powers also ratified the treaty.

Dr. W. A. Riddell, Canadian advisory officer at Geneva, announced that the Canadian government intended to submit to parliament a proposal to ratify the protocol, subject to reciprocity similarly with Great Britain.



Demoralization of the west coast army under General Francesco Topete, former governor of Sonora, was completed yesterday with the surrender of Colonel Miguel Guerrero and 500 soldiers to the federals at Ortiz, Sonora, and the flight of Topete, others of his staff, and Captain R.
