

#### MEXICAN PAYMASTER HELD WITH "ROLL"

Thousand dollar bills and gold coins meant nothing to Salvadore Ateca, left, once paymaster of the rebel forces in Mexico. He had about \$750,000 when he was taken into custody by Federal agents in a New York hotel as he was about to sail for Spain. The Federal Mexican Government claims this money is part of the loot from banks raided by the rebels during the recent rebellion, and that Ateca was trying to get away with it to Spain. Ateca says it is all his own. Antonio Gomez Maqueo, right, Ateca's secretary, was arrested at the same time as were to immigration officials who are believed to have conspired to aid Ateca's escape from the country.


