Waterfront Whiffs

Visit of H. M. S. Colombo Big Event for Coming week; Halibut Landings Holding Up; **Angling Season Commences**

The boys on the waterfront will have to shine up their buttons and put on their best clothes next week, for the navy is coming and there will be many visitors along the "front." The outstanding event of the week will be the visit to port, commencing at 4 o'clock Monday afternoon and ending on Tuesday of the week following, of the speedy British light cruiser Colombo, Capt. C. C. Dobson, V.C., D.S.O., attached to the North American and West Indies squadron.

This is the second visit of H. M. S. Colombo to this port and to the coast. She was here last in August 1927. Other ships of the same squadron that have been here are the Curlew and Cape-

The Colombo was built at Fairfield yards, Govan, Scotland, in 1918 and was commissioned a year later. She is 4,190 tons displacement and has a speed of 30 knots with 40,000 horsepower engines. Her length is 425 feet, beam 43 feet, six inches, and draught 4 feet, one inch. Her armament consists of five 6inch guns, two 3-inch anti-aircraft guns, four 3-pounders, and eight torpedo tubes.

Canadian halibut landings at the week ending Friday were heavier than average totalling 278,400 pounds while it was about the lightest week of the year in change of engines. volume of American landings which aggregated but 368,700 100 pounds brought the grand aggregate for the season to date up to 9,572,450 pounds as compared with last year's 9,150,050 pounds at a similar date. The grand total of Canadian fares amounted to 2,664,050 as against last year's 2,543,600 pounds while American landings were up to 6.908,400 pounds from 6,607,-200 pounds. There were only five market days during the week. there being no session of the exchange yesterday, Victoria Day. Heavy landings, particularly of American halibut, are anticipated during the coming week.

Prices during the week averaged higher than for a few weeks rrevious, the high price for Canadian fish being 15.8c and 7c which the Ternen was paid for 7,500 pounds while the top bid for American halibut was 16.6c and 9c offered the Viola for 7,-000 pounds. Low prices of the week were 12.3c and 6c paid the Canadian Bayview for 3,500 pounds and 31c and 6c received by the Columbia for 35,000


