Gus Pearson, well known Alice Arm prospector, who arrived in the city from the north a couple of days ago, left on this morning's train for a trip to Chicago.

Union freighter Chilliwack Capt. John Muir will sail this evening for the south with a cargo of fertilizer loaded at the plant of the Rupert Marine Products and cottonwood logs loaded at the dry dock.

Mrs. F. E. Alexander, who has been in the city for the past couple of weeks following the death of her brother, the late F. G. Dawson, will sail by the Prince Rupert this evening on her return to Vancouver.

Milton Gonzales submitted his resignation as a member of the Gyro Club at the club luncheon yesterday. The resignation was accepted with regret. Mr. Gonzales was the first president and one of the founders of the club.

Mrs. William Keith of Belfast, Ireland, who is visiting here with Mrs. William Beveridge, Third Avenue West, will sail tonight on the Prince Rupert for Vancouver where she will visit for the next few weeks, returning here after Christmas.

A letter from S. J. Willis, superintendent of education, advised the school board at its meeting last night that a number of important changes had been made governing the use of supplementary readers in the public schools. Henceforth, it was announced, the books to be used must be authorized by the Council of Public Instruction, the object being to eliminate all books of foreign origin. Co-operation of the board in seeing that only such books as were authorized be used was sought.

Mrs. T. M. Spencer acted in the chair at last night's regular monthly meeting of the board of school trustees in the absence of Chairman Thomas McMeekin who has been on a trip to the interior and is expected to return to the city this afternoon. Mrs. Spencer made an excellent chairman, too, carrying on the business with despatch and curbing certain tendencies toward volubility on the part of other trustees. Other trustees present were J. H. Thompson, William Gilchrist and W. J. E. Barrie, J. O. Williamson, secretary, was also in attendance as well as the principals of the various schools. The session lasted about an hour and a half, which is a good deal shorter than usual.

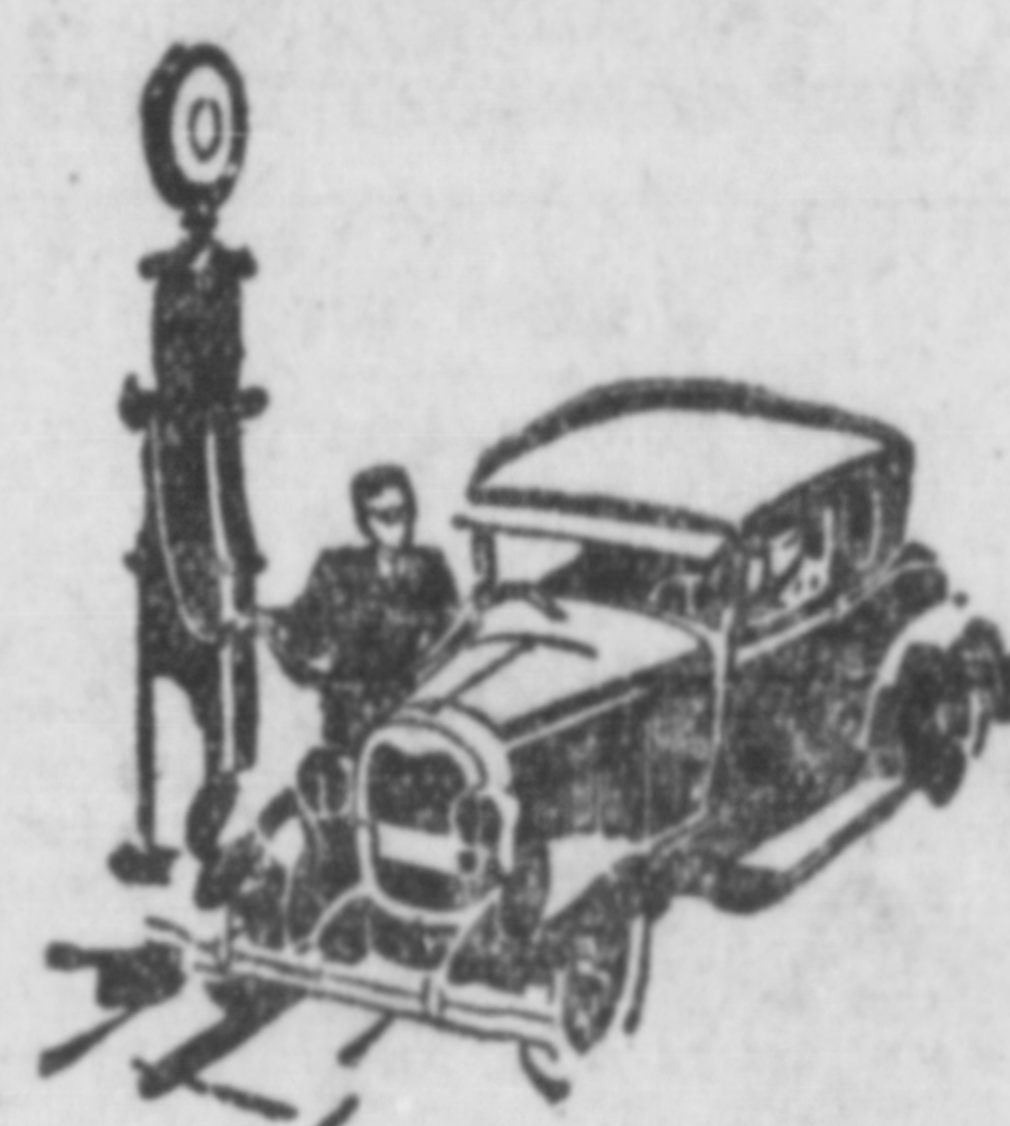
