LOCAL PARENT TEACHERS MEET

Address by Inspector Fraser
Heard on Subject of Junior High School

The chief item at the regular monthly meeting of the Parent-Teacher Association held last evening at the Borden Street School was the address by H. C. Fraser, inspector of schools.

Mrs. R. M. Winslow, president, was in the chair and there was a fair turn-out of members.

Mrs. Tucker was elected to fill the position of second vice-president. It was decided to have the usual sale of candy at the different schools prior to the breaking up for the Easter holidays and conveners were named for the different schools.

In response to a general demand for particulars regarding the Junior High School movement Mr. Fraser spoke on this topic. The psychological reasons for such an institution, its undoubted practical advantages to meet the present day's needs for a diversified choice of subjects in the elementary schools, the opportunities it provides for the pupils to try out their own inclinations regarding the phases of education most likely to fit in with their desires and leanings in business, commercial, agricultural occupations were all explained. Its superiority over the traditional elementary school was emphasized.

The great increase in school population in Prince Rupert with the consequent shortage of school accommodation, equipment, and staff was a statement that aroused considerable comment and clearly showed the need for new buildings in the very near future.

It was generally felt that the address might very well have been given before a public meeting and it is hoped that such an opportunity may be afforded Mr. Fraser to give this address on such an occasion.
