The fishing boat Zorra owned and operated by the Albin Fisheries Ltd., returned to port Thursday evening with 20,000 salmon. This is a record trip as she has only been out for four days.

In view of the recent announcement that the local tax rate was likely to be 14 mills on the dollar this year it is of interest to note that the Victoria rate has recently been struck at 26.65 mills.

Capt. Moorehouse of the Prince John reports to the Marine Department an uncharted rock in Buckley Bay, Massett Inlet. It is 450 feet northwestward from the northwest extreme of McCreight Island.

PRINCE RUPERT WATERFRONT LEASE

SEALED TENDERS will be received by the Minister of Lands, at Victoria, B. C., up to 12 o'clock noon on Thursday, 25th July, 1919, for the purchase of a lease of the waterfront tract of land forming part of the waterfront Lot "K," in the City of Prince Rupert, Province of British Columbia, and land covered by water lying in front of said waterfront lot "K," which may be more particularly described as follows:—
