Both the ball games played over the week end were won by the Vancouver team. This was what might be expected from the sort of playing which was carried on throughout the two matches. The home team fielded very well but when it came to bat there were very few safe hits in either game. If they ever did get on base the coaches never seemed to be able to get them around. They stuck tight to first base and usually died there. Harry Day and Frank Tinetti were the only men who seemed to know how to get down from first to second and these were the two players who brought in the two runs for the home team on Sunday.

In Saturday afternoon's game Harry Day had thirteen strike outs during the nine innings.

Ed Dravis and Nat Tinetti got home runs in the first game played on Saturday. They went over the rock pile and all they had to do was to walk home. The Rupert batters all got up and swung on nearly every pitched ball. If they connected it was a three bagger or a home run, but too often in their eagerness they fished after big wide outs, and fanned. Many times, too, when there was nothing on them but three balls and on strike they would let fly wildly at the next ball which came over instead of looking it over on the chance that it might be a ball.

Quigure, the first baseman for Vancouver, had the gentle art of bunting down to a science. He sacrificed more than one, however, but very often got to first base.

There were not very many swimmers at the Salt Lake Sunday afternoon. The weather was rather cold and uncomfortable on account of the fog which was hanging low all day. However, those who went in pronounced the water to be fine and evidently enjoyed their swim.

After the one on Sunday afternoon he rode home on his bicycle, cranking with one foot, the disabled limb projecting out to the side. Wood, manager of the Rat Portage Company of Vancouver, who is on his way north on a business trip to Skagway and will return south on the next trip of the Princess Mary. Mr. Wood will spend a little over a week in the north, as this is his first time to travel farther than Prince Rupert.
