Entry forms have been received by the sporting editor of the Daily News for the 1929 Dominion of Canada amateur boxing and wrestling championships under the auspices of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada which will be held at Port Arthur on the evenings of April 18, 19 and 20. Entries close April 13. The boxing classes are flyweight, bantamweight, featherweight, lightweight, Welterweight, middleweight, light heavyweight and heavyweight. Wrestling weights are the same except for flyweight. Only simon pure amateurs need apply.

W. F. Carey, known throughout the United States and Canada as a successful railway contractor, has been elected president of the Madison Square Gardens Association, succeeding the late Tex Rickard. W. F. Carey is known to many of the old-timers in the central interior of British Columbia, having been a member of Sims-Carey, the firm of which built the McBride section of the G.T.P. But Ruth's salary is received, to a large extent, because of his value as an attraction at the box office. The Waner boys are undoubtedly good "drawing cards," but probably no six major league players can equal Ruth when it comes to bringing in the dollars. 
