President Mosher at Third Annual Convention at Winnipeg Today Gives Address

WINNIPEG, Nov. 15.—In his address at the opening of the All-Canadian Congress of Labor here today, President A. R. Mosher said

"Our chief function, I believe, as a congress, must be the education of the workers to the point where they will see the necessity of forming national, industrial unions in every industry in Canada.
