JIMMIE M'LARNIN WIN ON POINTS AT MADISON SQUARE GARDENS LAST NIGHT

NEW YORK, Jan. 12. - Fighting in his lucky ring, Jimmy McLarnin of Vancouver, B.C., stepped back mong the top-notchers last night by whaling Joe Glick, bough Brooklyn lightweight, into defeat in a blood tinging 10-round battle at Madison Square Garden.

The stirring struggle before a capacity crowd of more than 19,500 re-opened the garden to boxing after Rickard's death. There were no knockdowns and the verdict was unanimous. McLarnin had the better fight in all the rounds but the first, eighth and tenth.
