Funds have been raised for the initial work of having surveys and topographical maps of the ground made. This work will go forward at once and immediately thereafter a golf expert is to have charge of the actual laying out of the course.

The work of organization was left to the board of directors of the Deer Mountain Golf Club, a corporation recently formed. The matter of finance was placed in the hands of a committee consisting of W. F. Schlotman, W. A. Pries and K. Jensen. H. C. Strong was elected manager of the club only for the purpose of providing for the surveys and this part of the project will be commenced immediately.

SWAT KING IS AGAIN SEEN IN BASEBALL GAME

Ruth Inspires the Yankees to Win Double Header But Is Rather Tired

CHICAGO IS LEADING

Gehrig Gets Nineteenth Homer on His Twenty-Sixth Birthday Against Boston

NEW YORK, June 20.—Chicago jumped into the National League lead yesterday by taking a double header from St. Louis before 45,000 cheering spectators.

The Giants won a double header from Philadelphia, the first going eleven innings. Melvin Ott hit his sixteenth and seventeenth homers in the first game while Chuck Klein of the Philadelphia hit his eighteenth.

Boston also took a double header from Brooklyn.

Cincinnati fell one run short of tying the Pirates in a ninth inning rally.

In the American League the Yankees trounced Boston in a game signaled by Gehrig's nineteenth homer on his twenty-sixth birthday and Ruth's return to the game. The Swat King sitting on the bench in the Yankee Stadium seemed to lend inspiration to the team and when the sixth inning game he took a hand in the game but soon showed signs of tiring.

Detroit disposed of Cleveland in a game called at the end of the seventh inning because of rain.

LAKES STOCKED JASPER PARK

JASPER, June 20.—Renowned for its beauty and its size, Maligne Lake, the largest lake in Jasper National Park and in the Canadian Rockies, will have another claim to fame. Within a few years it will be a fisherman's paradise. The stocking of Maligne Lake with speckled trout was a Dominion Government experiment and a triumph of the ingenuity of man. Maligne Lake is a high-altitude lake, situated at a depth of 10,000 feet. It is a beautiful lake, but last year the Government brought in 250,000 trout eggs, hatched them and dropped the fingerlings into the water. This year the fish are five and six inches long, are thriving on insects and are as lively as you like. O. Bright, superintendent of the Qu'Appelle hatchery, who has just concluded an inspection, has declared himself highly delighted with the results. A few days ago Maligne received 20,000 more inhabitants. They arrived in Jasper during the winter as eggs from Cresco, Pennsylvania. In addition to these, 40,000 rainbow trout from Montana have just been put into Cabin Lake.
