Prince Rupeprt has had more success, although there have been heartpangs for enthusiastic Prince Rupert boosters in the small total to date. On June 21 ne grain commission report showed 2,452,000 bushels credited in Prince Rupert.

Vancouver has shipped its great total this year through about 7,600,000 bushels of elevator space. Next year, if plans for elevator expansion go through, the total elevator accommodation will be in the vicinity of 11,000,-000 bushels.

It may be expected that Victoria and Prince Rupert will make strenuous efforts to get more grain. Prince Rupert's elevator is not financed by Prince Rupert ratepayers but was a government project. When it was leased to the Wheat Pool, citizens of Prince Rupert reckoned the problem of grain-getting quite solved. There have been some recriminations against the Wheat Pool's attitude toward the Prince Rupert elevator and a delegation was sent to interview heads of the


