Expected at Victoria That Line Will Be Controlled by C. P. R. Soon

VICTORIA, June 7.-Following the recent announcement that the Canadian Northeastern Railway at Stewart had been granted a lease of the foreshore at the head of Portland Canal, it is said here that the line will undoubtedly be taken over by C. P. R. interests as part of their scheme for developing the mines of Northern British Columbia through the Consolidated Mining & Smelting Co.

The understanding here is that the railway will be put in good shape up the Bear River as far as the George Copper and surveys will be carried out beyond that point. For the time being the railway will be used for mining purposes with the probability of extending it into the interior as the country develops. No official announcement has yet been made, but it is thought H. H. Stevens will be heard from very soon.


