TREASURER TO LEAVE CITY

E. D. Johnson Gets Important Post Under the Provincial Government.

E. D. Johnson, city treasurer, is leaving at the middle of the month. He has already resigned in order to take the position of inspector of revenue in the finance department of the provincial government, with headquarters at Victoria.

Mr. Johnson came to Prince Rupert over nine years ago in the employ of the G. T. P. and six years ago he accepted the position of city treasurer. Previous to coming here he had been with the G. T. P. five years in the east. He was born and educated in Gloucestershire, England, the county known to every cricket player of the world.

The position which Mr. Johnson has held so successfully will be difficult to fill, for it is not every man that has all the qualities which go to make a successful finance man. His training in municipal work and in dealing with taxes will be a great aid to him in his future career.

It is needless to say that Mr. Johnson will be missed here and that the best wishes of the community will go with him in his new work.

In the sport column of a recent issue it was mentioned that Jimmy Wilde was called the Kentish flyweight, and now the Welshmen of the city are up in arms to claim this nifty boxer who won by points over Moore in a recent twenty-round battle in the old country. To them Jimmy is the "Taylorstown Terror" and hails from the Rhondda valley near Pontypridd.

In the recent race staged at Edmonton between 40 pigeons which were brought away 525 miles from the city, a one-year-old bird was the winner. They were all released at daybreak on Saturday morning and the first one to arrive reached Edmonton at 4:15 a.m. on Sunday. The leading pigeon must have been very nearly home on Saturday night as it had to descend on account of the dark that evening. The next morning it arrived safe and sound such a short time after daybreak that it could only have been a short distance beyond the city limits.

Final arrangements have been completed for a boxing bout between Jack Britton, welterweight of the world, and Johnny Griffiths of Akron, Ohio, at the stock yards stadium August 7. The contest will be for twelve rounds.

Major Bill Gordon announces that he has arranged and obtained government sanction for a fifteen-round boxing contest to be held in Montreal at the end of this month between Jack Britton and Tex (Kid) Lewis. The receipts will be for the Army and Navy Veterans' Association and the bout will be held in the open air.

Away down in the wilds of Mexico J. Arthur Johnson, former king of the heavyweights, and Charles Cutler are busy teaching Bob Roper, former amateur heavyweight champion of America, how to defeat Jack Dempsey. Thus will Johnson do a second-hand come back. Roper weighs 208 pounds and stands 6 ft. 1 in. tall. Johnson has a whole staff of sparring partners and trainers teaching his proxy how to beat Dempsey.

It will be of interest to the local baseball players to know that the world's batting record has been secured by Joe Wilhoit, centre fielder of the Wichita Western League Club. He secured hits in 46 consecutive games. The Wichita fans presented him with a purse of more than \$600 in appreciation of the feat. This ought to be a very happy incentive for some of the heavy hitters who play on the market place every other evening. The boys ought to take note of their plays on an official score card so that they can have some idea when the season is over as to wherein they excel. They could make a record of all the special plays, errors, hits, runs, also stealing, etc.

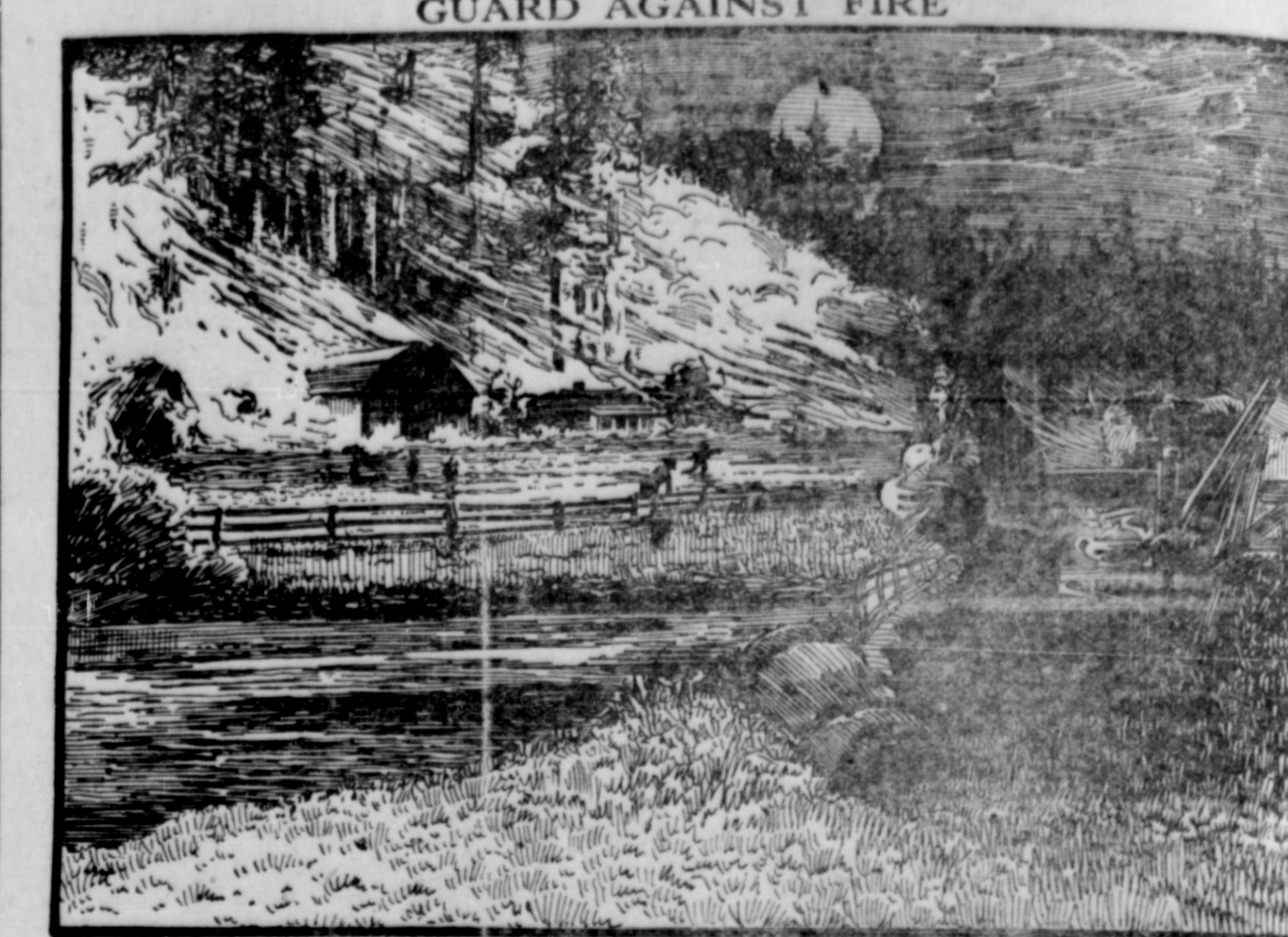
