The Pacific coast and all American automobile polo teams will clash for this year's championship of American polo at Rockford, Illinois, on August 6th. Spencer Willard and Charles Adams will make up the Pacific coast team.

The extra fence, constructed on the baseball field at Washington Park, Los Angeles, to give a better chance for home runs has been taken down. The fence shortened the field about sixty feet and caused so much controversy among players and patrons that the league management thought it best to return to former conditions.

Officials of the Hillburst football club in Calgary claim that before they think of going to Montreal to compete in the Connaught cup series, the Dominion football association will have to guarantee \$3,000 to cover transportation expenses. Hillburst figures that the trip will cost \$4,000 and they are prepared to put up the extra \$1,000. In the event that they do not go east they will favorably consider going to Vancouver for an exhibition series.

The National Lawn Tennis authorities have received the Australian team in America. The team which consists of Brookes, Patterson, Lycett and Thomas sailed from Liverpool last Monday. These include the winners of the English singles and doubles held at Wimbledon recently. The players went direct to Newport where the tournament opened today.

Oarsmen from Great Britain, Canada, Australia and New Zealand plan to visit the United States in September for races with American amateur sweeps. Major Paul Withington, a Harvard crew man, who is now overseas, sent a cablegram to his brother, Lathrop Withington of Boston, announcing the desire of the Colonials to compete with the Americans.

Wm. Harrison Dempsey, the new heavyweight champion, has received his first formal challenge from a Los Angeles boxer, Elmo Lincoln. Lincoln telegraphed a challenge to fight Thanksgiving Day to Dempsey who is now in Chicago. J. J. Jeffries and J. J. Corbett were said to have seen him work out and to have encouraged his aspirations. It was announced that if Dempsey gave him any encouragement Lincoln would train on the Jeffries farm near Los Angeles.

The best boxers of France are planning to visit the United States for a series of international matches. Carpenter is not included in the list of those who will visit America, although the heavyweight has received offers from American promoters concerning a match with Dempsey.

CELEBRATED DANCER ARRIVES IN THE CITY

Miss Peggy Standlee of Seattle is Visiting Her Grand Father in Prince Rupert.

Pretty Peggy Standlee of Seattle arrived in the city last week. She is one of Professor Douglas' best ballet dancers, the daughter of Mrs. H. L. Purdy and has gained much wonderful comment for her artistic dancing.

Peggy was juvenile queen at the Add Club carnival held in the Seattle Arena in 1914 and in this same year christened the huge drydock "Big Bill." She also appeared at an entertainment given by the Naval Sponsors of the U. S. Navy for the benefit of the Orphans' enlisted men of the United States navy.

Miss Standlee has danced at several Red Cross and star smoke fund benefits given in the Douglas Dancing Academy. She is a grand daughter of H. R. Jayne, chief marine engineer of the Prince Rupert drydock company. She will appear at several benefit entertainments to be given in the near future in Prince Rupert.

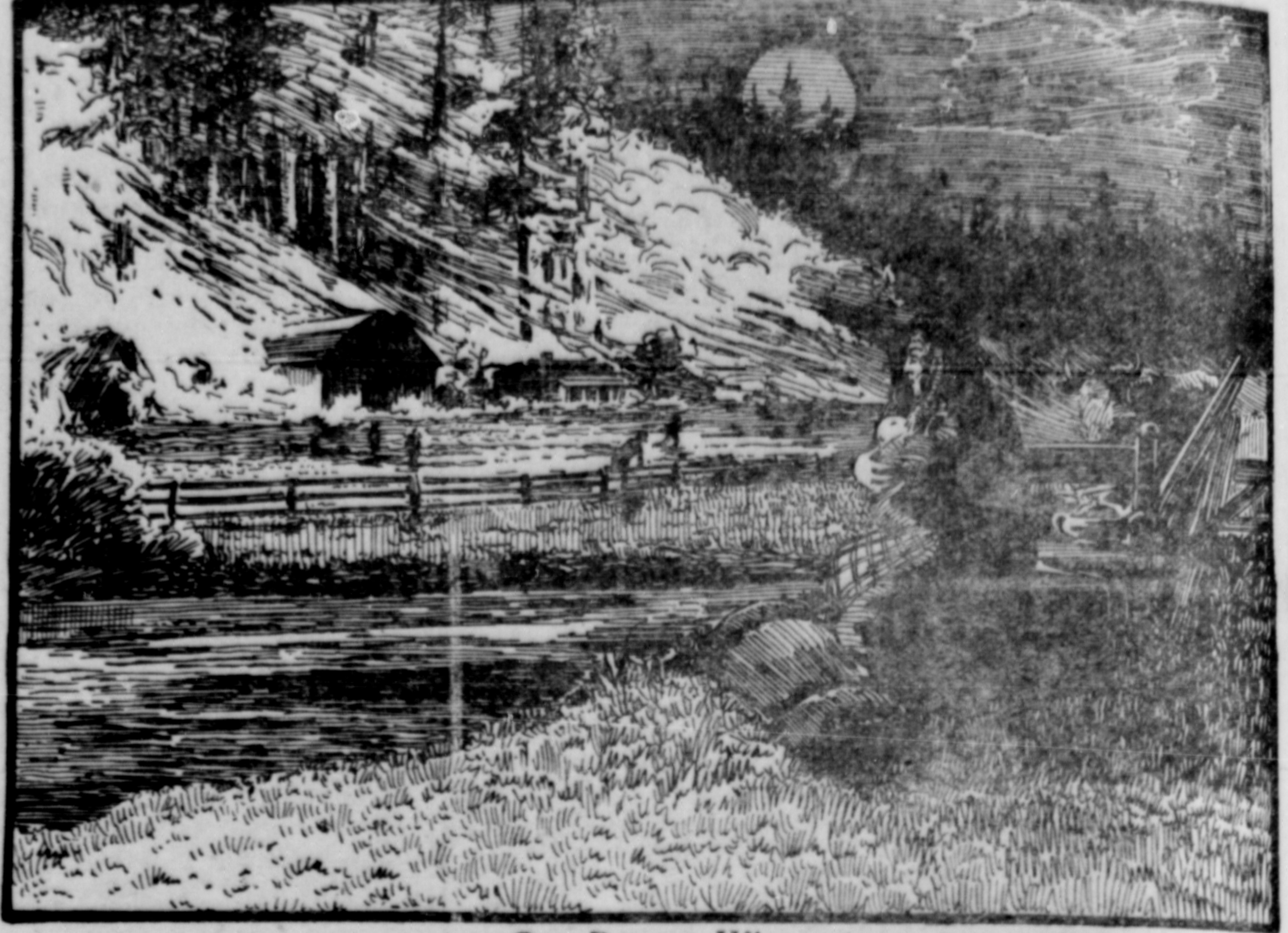
