"J. W. T. Mason, American correspondent, states in the London Daily Express: 'There is absolutely no "shimmy" dancing in Kansas City.'

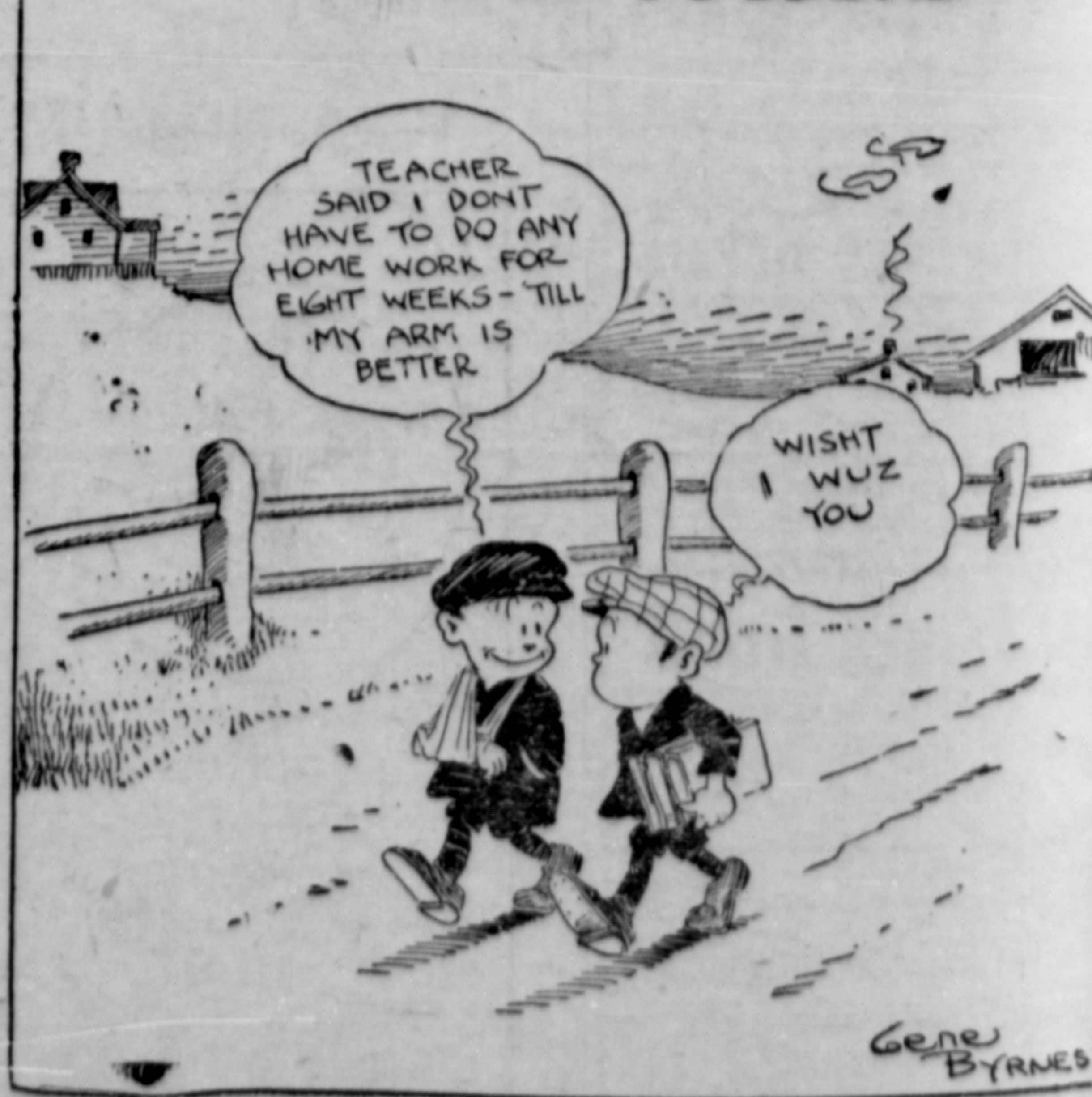
