YOGEN MARU RESCUE VESSEL

It was an odd coincidence that the Japanese freighter Yogen Maru which was reported yesterday to be standing by the United States Shipping Board steamer Alloway, in distress in mid-Pacific, was the same vessel which, a month or so ago, stood by and finally rescued the crew of the Chief Maquilla which sank in mid-Pacific. For the rescue of the Chief Maquilla crew, Capt. K. Matsuda and other officers of the Yogen Maru were honored by the Canadian Merchant Service Guild in Vancouver.

It was on the trip from Japan to Vancouver that the Yogen Maru rescued the Chief Maquilla crew. On the way back to Japan, she went to the aid of the Alloway yesterday.

The coincidence is all the more interesting in Prince Rupert by reason of the fact that the Yogen Maru loaded grain here the season before last.
